REMINDERS

Below are a couple of reminders around expectations, which help with the smooth day to day running at school.

- Lateness: We have noticed there is a high frequency of students that are arriving to school late every day. Please remember that lessons start at 8:55am, so it is important students arrive at least 10 minutes before this to ensure they are organised for the day and have had the opportunity to connect with their friends. We all know how arriving late can have a negative impact on the whole day, this can be the same for children. Please ensure your children are at school by 8:45am each morning so they are set up for success!
- School Gates: For safety reasons for many of our students, school gates need to be closed during school hours. If you are visiting school during school time, please ensure you close the gate behind you. Most gates are self-closing but at times they don't latch back into place, so it is important to check each time.
- **Dogs at School:** As mentioned in previous newsletters, we are happy for dogs to be a school but it is essential the dogs remain on a lead and are with their owner at all times. Do not leave your dog unattended.
