STAFFING UPDATE



CULTURAL DAY AND MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS

On **Thursday, 27 June** we will be holding a 'Cultural Day' to celebrate the different cultures represented at Boulcott School. To help us celebrate and explore the different cultures represented at Boulcott, we would like to invite parents and whanau to come in to school to share an aspect of their culture with their child's class. Examples of possible activities include: making traditional art, sharing a holiday celebration, storytelling, sharing traditional clothing, jewellery or objects and teaching dance, games, language, calligraphy, or music. Making food from different cultures is also extremely popular with children!

This sharing does not need to be long or complicated. Even 5 - 10 minutes of your time to share a song or to show the class a beautiful traditional costume would be a wonderful opportunity for children to either learn about a different culture or to be proud to see their own culture in the classroom.

If you have an idea for an activity or an element of your culture you would like to share please let your child's teacher know. They will organise a time with you (this does not have to be on the 27th, there is a lot of flexibility around times and dates) and can help with organising supplies and resources that may be required.

On the evening of Thursday, 27 June, we would like to invite all our families to join us for a community hangi to celebrate Matariki from 5pm to 7pm.

Our amazing Whānau Group, with help from the children, will be cooking a delicious hangi for us. Local children's book Author, Moira Wairama, will retell the Matariki legend, and we will have performances and sharing from the children.

The hangi food available will be:

- * Lamb
- * Chicken
- * Root vegetables (pumpkin, kumara, potatoes)
- * Homemade bread

The cost for food will be \$6 per person or \$25 per family group (maximum two adults). Under fives are free.

This is not a fundraising event. All of the money collected will be put towards purchasing food. We would gratefully receive any donations of root vegetables (pumpkin, kumara or Agria potatoes). We also invite you to bring along a plate of sweet food that can be eaten without cutlery to share.



The event will go ahead even if the weather is bad. All children must be accompanied by an adult who is able to supervise them at all times.

As an Enviro-school we aim to avoid waste, so the the food will be served buffet style on trestle tables. Please bring your own plates, utensils and water bottles. These will need to be taken home to be washed. Also bring your own cushions, rugs or mats to sit on. Please note that alcohol may not be consumed during the evening. Dogs are not permitted at this event.



Holiday Programmes


