Distance Learning

Officially Term 2 starts today but it looks quite different to the usual start of term! We hope the first day went ok for you all. A reminder that teachers will be sharing daily learning experiences on Seesaw (Year 1-4) and Google Classroom (Year 5 & 6) for children to complete at a time that suits. We appreciate that the programmes are not going to work for every family so there are no expectations to complete anything. We trust that you will make the right decisions for your family in your unique situation. Our number one goal during this time (as should be yours too) is to focus on the well-being of all of us (students, parents and staff).

Latest Media Updates

Many of you will have seen differing reports in the media about when and how schools will reopen once we move down from Alert Level 4. There is a lot of misinformation out there so I thought it best that you hear it from the horse's mouth (with the Ministry of Education being the horse!).

The five main points are:

- 1. No decision has been made yet about when schools will reopen. This decision will be made based on data about the spread of Covid-19 and how we are going to stamp it out. It is unlikely that a decision will be made before 20 April.
- 2. The very earliest schools would open would be 29 April. And this would likely only be for SOME students, not all.
- 3. The Ministry (and us) are preparing for several possible scenarios opening only for staff, opening for essential workers' children, opening in shifts so that children can stay 2m apart, opening for just Senior students, a combination of distance and on-site learning, staggered opening, not opening for a number of weeks etc. We want to be prepared for whatever the decision is once the data becomes clear. This, of course, is a massive amount of

thinking and planning. Our biggest focus will always be "What is best for the children and staff of Boulcott School!"

- 4. There will be ample notice before schools open. They will not be closed one day and open the next. We will be given ample time to ensure that the school has a deep-clean, that our planning for the term is completed and that we put in place any Health & Safety regulations.
- 5. The Ministry has been VERY clear that we will NOT be moving out of Alert Level 4 early. Chris Hipkins is, this week, working on guidelines for what Alert Level 3 could look like for schools. We look forward to his guidance on this matter.

FREE N4L safety filter for all students

The Ministry of Education and Network 4 Learning have set up a safety filter that parents can set up on their child's learning devices from home. Just go to switchonsafety.co.nz to find clear instructions on how to do this.

The free N4L safety filter (by global cyber-security leader, Akamai) blocks websites containing known cyber threats like phishing scams, malicious content and viruses, while also protecting children from content deemed the worst of the web (like adult sites).

It is an extension of one of the many safety and security services we have in place at school and is a valuable layer of protection to help keep children safe online. Please remember that technology is not a silver bullet and the filter should be used in combination with Netsafe's <u>online parent safety toolkit</u>.

IT Devices & Home Learning Packs.

Just a reminder about what was communicated in the newsletter last week regarding IT devices and hard-copy learning packs. The Ministry of Education are arranging for:

- Homes to be connected to the internet if there is no connectivity already.
- Devices to be sent to homes where there are none.
- Packs of learning materials to be delivered to these homes where there is no access to internet or devices. See https://learningfromhome.govt.nz/supporting-learning for the content.

NOTE: This is to meet the needs of students who currently have no access to learning. This is being rolled out in groups. The priority group is secondary students doing NCEA, followed by where there is the greatest need due to disadvantage. It is also dependent on the availability of devices.

Home Learning TV

From the 15th April, there will be one channel for your child that will have programmes suitable for them to watch.

- This is to 'supplement' what we are providing as a school.
- Will run 9am to 3pm on school days on TVNZ2+1 and Sky channel 502.
- Some lessons will also be available on TVNZ On Demand.
- Content will cater for pre-school to 15 years of age and cover
- a broad curriculum that includes movement, music, physical

education, well-being, numeracy, literacy and science through an integrated approach to curriculum.


