Principal's Message: Thursday, 12 September, 2024

The last two weeks at Boulcott School have been filled with lots of fun activities and visitors.

Nano girl aka 'Alchemist Marina' visited us with her Matter Marvels - Amazing Atoms show! This science show wowed our whole school audience. The 'Matter Marvels' show looked at

solids, liquids and gases in temporary and permanent states. It had fire (held in the palm of her hand), smoke bubbles, disappearing experiments and elephants' toothpaste!! Great fun and educational!! Awesome!!

We also recently held our Boulcott School 'Jump Off' - another highly successful, and hugely fun skipping rope themed House Competition.

Whilst we were all winners on the day, the House Cup was awarded to our bluest of houses: Tūi. Congratulations Tūi!!

Over the last two weeks classes have been enjoying a series of lessons in **Softball**, led by members of the Hutt Valley Softball Association. Children have been learning basic softball skills of throwing and catching, fielding and batting as well as playing mini games. Ask your child about which part of the lessons they have enjoyed the most. If they are interested in playing softball there are registration forms at the office.

Jel Pollock is a Community Educator for St John in Wellington. She has been giving all students at Boulcott a 1-hour workshop on '**Responding to an Emergency**', as a way to empower our children with REAL life saving skills.

These workshops have included DRSABC, rolling patients on their side, CPR, what constitutes an emergency, burns, choking and answering any first aid related questions. Our students leave with a deeper understanding of what constitutes an emergency, how to call for help and what happens if you call 111. This is such super valuable information that all ages can take and use to literally save a life. St John have taught over 1 million young people these same lifesaving skills and now our tamariki have joined this awesome group!

On Wednesday, we had a visit from our **Minister of Education: Erica Stanford** and our local MP and **Minister for Housing: Chris Bishop**. Erica had specifically asked to come to our school to launch the Structured Literacy / Phonics programme on TV One News. At Boulcott we have of course been using a Structured approach to literacy for several years now. The Ministers visited several classes and chatted to staff and students about their phonics learning. Mrs Henry and Room 6 students also featured on the news doing a Structured Literacy lesson, as well as Mrs Hassell and two students from Rm 11 who were doing a phonics assessment. Our tamariki were super excited to meet our special guests and our Junior students along with Matua Whaitiri welcomed them with two beautiful waiata.

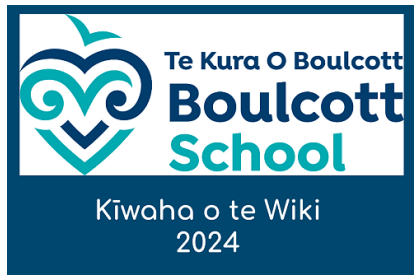

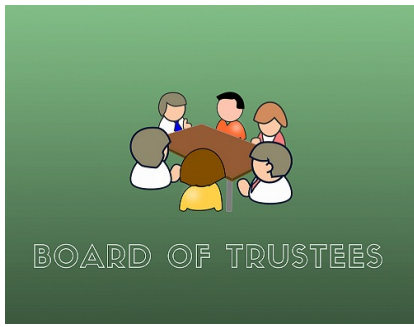

Board News

Term 3

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, 9 September 2024 for our second meeting of Term 3. The meeting was Margie Bargh's final one as Presiding Member ("chair"), although she will remain on the Board until the current Board period ends next year. The Board thanks Margie for her contributions as chair - she oversaw the Principal appointment process and has been superb at ensuring strong relationships between the Board and the community, and smoothing transitional periods

during the Principal change and Board changes. Margie has contributed as chair (since February 2021), as a Board member (co-opted November 2020 then elected September 2022) and prior to that minute taker (August 2019), as well as volunteering and supporting school life as a parent. Thanks Margie!

Hi everyone I hope you are having a good week, can't believe we are almost at the end of Term 3. So this week it is my turn to introduce myself. My name is Jacqui Isaac (but you can call me Jax) and I was voted on to the Board in 2022. I took up the role of Deputy Chair at that time and just recently I have taken up the role of the Presiding Member. A role that I am really excited to get stuck into, but I have some big shoes to fill from our previous Presiding Member, Margie who has done a wonderful job.

So a little bit about me outside of the Board. I am married to Daryl for nearly 17 years and we have two beautiful children that attend the School, Maddie in Year 4 and Matilda who just started and is in Year 0.
