What gorgeous weekend weather we have had lately, a great opportunity for us all to get out and enjoy the great outdoors.

At the end of this week, we are half way through our first term of school for 2025.

We have as usual had a busy and fun last couple of weeks. Year 6 student leadership roles have been given out (more about this later in the newsletter) and we have officially welcomed our new whānau, and kaiako at our first Mihi Whakatau. The mihi whakatau is one of our ceremonies where not just our tamariki learn, but everyone learns.

- Our students learn about manaakitanga the process of warmly welcoming our new whānau into the school.
- Our manuhiri (visitors/ new whānau) learn the customs of the school.
- Ou Senior Māori kids learn about karanga and mihi, and how to deliver a very short but appropriate one.
- Teachers/parents/students can listen and understand (or try to) the speeches and ceremonies, drawing on their Te Reo learnt to date.

This welcome celebration was really beautiful. Dusty and Jonty confidently shared their mihi with us all and Mia, Elizabeth, Maddie and MacKenzie acted as karanga for us.



We have finally finished swimming for 2025, which will be a relief for many parents from the daily washing of swimming togs and towels. Classes can now settle in to some serious learning for the year.

Teachers are enjoying getting their heads around our new Pr1me Maths resources, and classes are experimenting with gradually using the student workbooks and will soon be trying out the online MathsPro website.

After a few weeks of meeting with small groups and individual students our Accelerated Learning Teacher, Lisa Hassell, will be beginning her across school ESOL support programme, ALIM Maths support for Kahikatea students and literacy support for Kōwhai students. We are very fortunate to have Lisa providing this support, which has largely been funded by our Board.

I was fortunate to be able to spend a couple of hours with 16 of our Kahikatea students who represented our school at Hutt Cricket Association's Non-Stop Cricket Tournament. It was all about taking part and having a go. I was super impressed with our kids' sportsmanship and sporting prowess. Go Boulcott!!

You can start collecting yummy stickers at anytime! Please keep collecting if you can, place the Yummy stickers on sticker collection sheets

(available from your classroom teacher) and bring them into school.

Get your friends, family, neighbours collecting the Yummy Fruit Stickers to help out Boulcott School. Shop at your local New World, Pak 'n' Save, or participating Four Square stores.

Purchase Yummy apples, either bags with cut-out labels or individual apples with Yummy stickers. One cut-out label is worth 10 Yummy stickers! Place the Yummy stickers on sticker collection sheets and bring them into school.

Our Yummy stickers will then be converted into a winning share of the \$200,000 sports prize pool from DG Sport.

Kia Ora parents and caregivers,

To support your child's travel on **Metlink services**, please note the following important point.

 High school students are required to present their secondary school photo ID when requested by onboard staff if not in uniform. For eligibility information please check the concessions section here.

Below is a summary of the conditions of carriage. The full version can be found here:

- Children from age 5 and intermediate school students are entitled to the Child Concession while in or out of school uniform.
- Secondary school students must either be wearing their school uniform, or present a valid physical or digital secondary school photo ID.
- A Snapper enabled Student Photo ID can be used as a Snapper card to access the Child Concession.
- Children 16 or older who have left school do not qualify for a Child Concession.
- Tag on and off for each part of the journey. If you do not tag off, a default fare applies, see more information <u>here</u>.
