There are nearly 600 students at Lansvale School from Years 1-6 with 94% of them coming from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds. I'm now eager to reflect on how we can adapt some of these approaches to enhance our own school culture and learning environment. Whether it's strengthening community

partnerships, refining our teaching strategies, or further supporting our diverse learners, I look forward to sharing these ideas with our leadership team and staff to explore what could work in our own context.

Our visit to Google Headquarters and Microsoft Head Office were enlightening experiences to explore the latest trends in AI in education and see firsthand how these advancements are shaping the future of teaching and learning. At Google, we learned about AI-driven tools that enhance student engagement, streamline administrative tasks, and support personalised learning pathways. Microsoft showcased innovative ways AI is being used to foster creativity, collaboration, and accessibility in the classroom.



These visits have sparked plenty of ideas about how emerging technologies can support both students and teachers. I'm looking forward to discussing these possibilities with our team and thinking strategically about how we can incorporate some of these innovations in a way that aligns with our school's vision and needs.


Launchpad

We started the year looking at the life of Moses. For this lesson we were learning to be strong and courageous like Joshua. Penny had an activity to challenge us!!








