Board News

Update

Meeting update: The Board met on 31 March 2025 for its second meeting this year. We reviewed and approved the draft annual accounts before they are fully audited. We heard about Rachael Sole's visit to Sydney where she heard

about how major tech companies, Microsoft and Google, are supporting education and how those companies are developing AI tools. These are important things to stay across and understand.

Welfare fund: Many families are doing it tough at the moment with the cost of living. The Board has decided to establish a "welfare budget". This fund is supplemented by generous families who have expressed that they would like to assist other Boulcott children or whānau, who may otherwise find it difficult to meet the costs of school activities. If you are in a difficult financial situation, you can have a quiet word with Tania in the office or your child's teacher and the Welfare Fund may be able to subsidise some of those costs.

Wishing staff well: In staffing news, the Board was sad to hear that Hannah Watkins is wrapping up her six years at Boulcott School. She was a Teacher Aide and then a friendly face at the school reception desk making sure everyone felt welcome and kids looked after. Hannah is leaving to spend more time with family. However, we were also very pleased to hear that her role at reception will be taken up by Donna Larsen, who is well-known as one of our valued Teacher Aides.

Update

Our tamariki have been working hard in Kapa Haka, deepening their understanding of tikanga and refining their performance skills!

This term, the tamariki of Boulcott have been learning about Tānerore, who is associated with the origin of haka. They've mastered our Boulcott Waiata and actions, along with the correct kupu

for Tūtira Mai Ngā lwi and Whakataka Te Hau. I will attach the lyrics to our School Waiata below so you can practise at home!

Harakeke is focusing on Te Reo Māori vowel sounds, along with pronunciation and have started learning Kei Wareware i a Tātou, a waiata from Te Kuru Marutea that went viral during Te Matatini this year. Meanwhile, Kōwhai have begun exploring the pūrākau of Rona and the Moon and will be learning the accompanying waiata and poi actions next week.

Kahikatea is now in HuttFest prep mode! Our Waiata Leaders are deciding on this year's Waiata-ā-Ringa, with options including Ka Pioioi, E te Hokowhitu a Tū, and Karanga Aotearoa. They have also learned Kei Wareware i a Tātou, and a whopping 55 Kahikatea students (half of the syndicate!) are auditioning for solo parts this week—ka rawe and good luck to all! We can't wait to see our tamariki shine!


